- ☐ data by sex
- information relevant to gender equality
- ☐ information describing the lives of women

Why do we want them?

- Highlight gender differences and inequalities
- Analytical tool, to better describe the situation of men and women

- Economic Activity
- Health
- Less in Empowerment

More can be mined

Where will that take us?

- o Further analysis of existing CAS data
- Strengthen flow of administrative data suitable for gender analysis
- o Integrate gender into future survey program
 - proposed labor force survey
 - upcoming survey of HHLC by
 - addressing gender issues explicitly
 - tabulation plan on gender issues
 - analysis and write-up
 - dissemination

Future steps

Continued user/ producer dialogue to build gender indicator and data base

- on needs with respect to data and indicators on gender
- on facilitating data sharing, especially administrative data
